Dino Paleo Art



I. Welcome

Be sure to have your materials ready before the video session starts and always ask an adult for help and permission.

- **II. Activity Overview**
 - Today you will get to step into the shoes of a Paleo-Artist. Take out your art supplies and get ready for a challenge. We will be learning how artists and scientists work together to try and figure out what animals of the past looked like.
- **III.** Grade Levels K-12 (D, B, J, C, S, A)
- **IV. Activity**
 - Step 1: Take your dinosaur skeleton print out and put your tracing paper over it
 - Step 2: Trace around your dinosaur skeleton to make the outline of the dinosaur. Look at the bones the dinosaur has and think about how that might impact what its body would look like.
 - Step 3: Add scales, feathers, color, teeth, toes, or whatever you think
 your dino might have had in the prehistoric times. Use your imagination
 and knowledge of dinosaurs you already have to draw your dino. It is AOK if you don't know much about dinosaurs, the early scientists who
 discovered them didn't either! This activity is about learning what those
 scientists went through to give us the pictures we have of dinosaurs
 today.
