I. Welcome and Opening Flag Ceremony

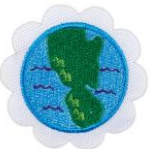
Be sure to have your materials ready before the video session starts and always ask an adult for help and permission.

IV. Grade Levels

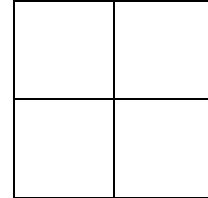
- All campers are welcome to join to learn and participate in the activity

V. Activity

- What is a neighbor and what does it mean to be a good neighbor?
 - Give us examples of good deeds that are helpful to those who we identify as our neighbors.
- Explore your school!



- Although we may all go to different schools, we will examine one school – Texas A&M University-San Antonio. We will give tips on what you can search for on the web about your school!
- See what makes your State special – we will learn interesting fun facts about Texas!
- As we learn about these cool facts, we will be writing them down in our camp journals
- Now that we have completed our research, cut out your State and divide your state into 4 quadrants.
- In 1 of the quadrants – write out what makes you a good neighbor and draw an image if you like! Be sure to leave room for other areas and color the quadrant!
- In another quadrant write out your school name or your dream school! Write out the mascot, write your grade and try to draw the mascot (use your school colors).
- In another quadrant, (you can do this where your city is located) star where your city is and write out your cities fun facts – what makes it so special! Make sure to color in your quadrant.
- Example: San Antonio has the Riverwalk and the Alamo!
- In another quadrant, write out fun facts about your state – state bird, state motto, population, and what you love about your state! Make sure to color in your quadrant.
